Overview

The School of Architecture and Built Environment (<https://architecture.tulane.edu/>) offers a range of dual degree opportunities for graduate students interested in broadening their academic and professional preparation. These integrated programs allow students to pursue complementary disciplines within a coordinated course of study, supporting interdisciplinary knowledge and expanded career pathways. By aligning curricula across programs, dual degree options can reduce the total time to completion compared to pursuing the two degrees independently.

Students must be admitted to both programs to pursue a dual degree.
